



















An HTA licence for storage of tissue for research purposes is not necessary.

An HTA licence for storage of tissue is only required if you are storing 'relevant material'.

An HTA licence for storage of tissue for research purposes is not necessary.

The Human Tissue Act 2004 licensing regulations came into force on 1 September 2006, existing holdings obtained before this date are exempt from licensing.

A licence is not required if storing tissues solely for use in a REC-approved project.

A licence is not required if your tissue had been obtained from a Research Ethics Committee (REC)-approved tissue bank.

If there is no intention to use or store human cellular material for research, and the only holding of the material is temporary (hours to a few days) and for the purpose of obtaining material which does not contain cells, then no HTA storage licence is required.
